- Fringe Tree, *Chionanthus virginicus*. Deciduous shrub bearing white flowers in early June and having bright yellow Fall color. Habitat New Jersey to Florida.
- Douglas Fir, *Pseudotsuga taxifolia*. Narrow leafed evergreen with a densely pyramidal habit and horizontal branching. Native of Rocky Mts. and Pacific coast.
- Wintergreen Barberry, *Berberis julianae*. Evergreen shrub with spines and blueish-black berries. Native to Central China.
- Japanese Barberry (Red leafed variety), *Berberis thunbergii atropurpurea*. Much branched shrub. Branches with many spines. Introduced from Japan about 1864.
- Norway Spruce, *Picea abies*. Narrow leafed evergreen with a pyramidal habit. Native to north and central Europe and cultivated in eastern North America.
- Juniper, *Juniperus procumbens*. Narrow leafed evergreen shrub with low spreading branches. Cultivated in Japan.
- Flowering Dogwood, *Cornus florida*. Deciduous tree valued for its beautiful display of white flowers in the Spring. Native of eastern U. S.
- Winter Honeysuckle, *Lonicera fragrantissima*. Semi-evergreen valued for its foliage and very fragrant flowers.
- Oriental Elm, *Zelkova serata*. Deciduous tree somewhat similar to an Elm, with many ascending branches. Native to Japan.
- Fernleaf European Beech, *Fagus sylvatica laciniata*. Deciduous tree with a fine textured foliage and deeply cut to almost regularly lobed leaves. Native of central and southern Europe.
- English Hawthorn, *Crataegus oxyacantha Paulii*. Deciduous shrub with scarlet flowers and lobed leaves. Native to Europe and northern Africa.
- Scarlet Oak, *Quercus coccinea*. Deciduous tree noted for its brilliant scarlet Fall color. Native of eastern and central U. S.
- Fragrant Viburnum, *Viburnum carlcephelum*. Deciduous shrub with coarse foliage and fragrant flowers, of hybrid origin.
- Oriental Arborvitae, *Thuja orientalis*. Narrow leafed evergreen with lustrous, scale-like foliage usually arranged in planes, the edges of which face the outside of the plant. Native to northern China and Korea.
- Japanese Andromeda, *Pieris japonicum*. Broad leafed evergreen with hanging white flower clusters in mid-April. Native of Japan.
- Mountain Laurel, *Kalmia latifolia*. Broad leafed evergreen shrub requiring acid soil, valued for its pink and white flowers which bloom in mid-June and form large clusters. Its native habitat is eastern North America.
- Japanese Yew, *Taxus cuspidata*. Narrow leafed evergreen, having dark needle-like foliage with red, fleshy berries. Native to Japan and Korea.
- Norway Maple, *Acer platanoides*. Deciduous tree with dense foliage, notable for its early display of yellow-green flowers and yellow Fall color. Europe and the Caucasus.
- Oregon Grape Holly Mahonia, *Mahonia aquifolium*. Semi-green shrub with lustrous dark green foliage. Its native habitat extends from British Columbia to Oregon.
- Weeping Higan Cherry, *Prunus subhirtella Pendula*. Deciduous tree with weeping branches bearing pink flowers in the Spring. Native of Japan.
- Austrian Pine, *Pinus nigra*. Narrow leafed evergreen having two needles in a bundle and dark green, stiff foliage. Native to central and southern Europe & Asia Minor.
- Scarlet Firethorn, *Pyracantha coccinea*. Deciduous shrub with bright red berries in the Fall. Native to Italy and western Asia.

- Warty Barberry, *Berberis verruculosa*. Evergreen shrub with leathery leaves which are white underneath and spiny. Its native habitat is western China.
- Hardy Orange, *Poncirus trifoliata*. Deciduous shrub or tree sometimes used as a hedge because of its dense growth and prominent spines. Native to north China.
- Colorado Spruce, *Picea pungens*. Narrow leafed evergreen with a stiffly pyramidal habit. Native to Utah and New Mexico.
- Scotch Pine, *Pinus Sylvestris*. Narrow leafed evergreen with two twisted, bluish-green needles per bundle, also having red bark on the older trunks and branches. Native of Europe and Siberia.
- Winter Honeysuckle, *Lonicera fragrantissima*. Semi-evergreen valued for its foliage and very fragrant flowers.
- Leatherleaf Mahonia, *Mahonia bealii*. Broad leafed evergreen with dull foliage and bluish-black, grape-like fruit. The leaves are held stiffly horizontal. China.
- Siebold Viburnum, *Viburnum sieboldi*. Deciduous shrub having dark green, lustrous foliage and creamy white flowers in flat clusters during late May. Japan.
- Burkwood Viburnum, *Viburnum burkwoodi*. Deciduous shrub having shiny foliage in mid-May, bearing pink flowers. Native habitat, Korea.
- Callery Pear, *Pyrus calleriana*. Deciduous tree notable for its white flowers in early May. Its Fall color is red to glossy scarlet, Native habitat, China.
- White Ash, *Fraxinum americana*. Deciduous tree with compound leaves which have a yellow Fall color. Native to eastern U. S.
- Red Maple, *Acer rubrum*. Deciduous tree, notable for its brilliant red Fall color and for its profuse display of small, red flowers in the Spring. E. and central N. A.
- Black Locust, *Robinia pseudocacia*. Deciduous tree having white pea-like flowers in pendulous clusters during early June. Native to eastern U. S.
- Siberian Crab Apple, *Malus baccata*. Deciduous tree valued for its white, very fragrant flowers. Native to northeastern Asia.
- Red Pine, *Pinus resinosa*. Narrow leafed evergreen tree with dark green, lustrous needles, two in a bundle which snap readily. Bark reddish brown. Native of north-central and northeastern North America.
- Jack Pine, *Pinus banksiana*. Narrow leafed evergreen with two slightly twisted needles of yellowish-green to the bundle. Habitat northern and northeastern North America.
- Red Oak, *Quercus borealis*. Deciduous tree having dense, lustrous foliage. The overall habit is broad and round topped when old. Northeastern and central North Amer.
- Black Oak, *Quercus velutina*. Deciduous tree having lustrous dark green foliage and a red Fall color, rather similar to Red Oak. Native to eastern and central U. S.
- Mountain Pine, *Pinus mugo*. Narrow leafed evergreen shrub, usually low growing, having two needles to the bundle, native to eastern Alps.
- Canadian Hemlock, *Tsuga canadensis*. Narrow leafed evergreen with small needle-like leaves and gracefully drooping branches, native to northeastern North America.
- Mentor barberry, *Berberis mentorensis*. Semi-evergreen shrub with spiny leaves about one inch long. Of hybrid origin.
- Barberry, *Berberis neuberti*. Deciduous shrub, the younger leaves of which are spiny, a cultivar which originated before 1854.
- European Cranberry Viburnum, *Viburnum opulus*. Deciduous shrub with opposite leaves and black to red berries. It is also notable for its white flowers and purplish red Fall color.
